Litany of Invitation and Commitment - Commitment Sunday 2020

Based on II Corinthians 8: 1-15

Leader: In this world of suffering and poverty, hunger and thirst, violence and tragedy,

People: Where often we are overwhelmed and even apathetic,

Leader: We recall the earliest followers of Jesus, who even in their own poverty, found something to give.

People: For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has,

Leader: Not according to what one does not have.

People: There should not be relief for some and pressure for others;

Leader: Rather, it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need,

People: So that their abundance may be for your need,

All: In order that there be a fair balance.

Leader: The one who had much did not have too much,

People: And the one who had little did not have too little.

Leader: Nothing left over to the one with the most;

People: Nothing lacking to the one with the least.

All: Let us be eager to give, according to what we have; enough for all, so that everybody is in on God's abundant love.
